I Believe... A study of questions of faith

Do you know what you believe? Can you articulate what you believe about the most fundamental questions of faith? Who is God? Why is he concerned for Man? What is Sin? What role should scripture play in your life? Was Jesus a man – or God? What is the role of the church today? Is there a heaven or hell? Why do they call Jesus – Savior?

No matter where you are along the journey of your life, these questions demand your consideration. Have you worked out – FOR YOURSELF – what you believe about these questions? Can you articulate why (and offer proof) for what you believe to be true?

This 13-lesson series will NOT provide you answers to what you should believe (that is yours alone to work-out), but it will provide you a starting point for the inquiry into several of pressing faith questions. In fact, the scriptures selected to start your study are NOT completed and may not be the ones that most clearly describe each topic – but are selected to engage your thinking/consideration.

If you are not a believer in God and His work among men, it will provide you a systematic way to examine the questions demanding answers from you. If you are a believer, then this series perhaps can assist you in sharpening your understanding and ability to articulate clearly YOUR faith (not that of the minister, parent or friend). Either way, this lesson series is offered to you as a tool to explore and define what YOU believe about these questions of faith.

The Purpose of Instructional Program

This 13-lesson series is designed to

- Engage the seeker in a personal journey to build their own faith;
- Provide the seeker a starting point for their journey into the scriptures to build personal understanding;
- Encourage the seeker to identify new questions for inquiry;
- Engage a group to share their faith (based on knowledge); and,
- Challenge the seeker to articulate (and defend) a personal statement of their own beliefs related to each topic AND define specific implications of their faith in their daily lives.

Within each lesson we will ask the following questions:

- What do these scriptures reveal about the topic?
- What additional scriptures shed light on the topic?
- What additional study is required?
- What is the implication for my daily life?

How to Use this Program

This program is designed to facilitate your bible study and development of a stronger personal faith. This 13-lesson series can be used individually, in a group-based (classroom) study — or ideally, in a combination of both personal study and group discussion and sharing.

Each topic lesson will provide:

- A brief introduction to the topic.
- A few **inquiry questions** to stimulate your thinking/wonder.
- Seven key scripture references and space for your personal notes to help you INITIATE and DOCUMENT your study of the topic

- Space for you to add additional scripture references and/or notes you discover during your study and discussions.
- Space to list new questions your study raises and/or areas where you desire additional focused study.

Personal Application – in addition each lesson provides you the opportunity to directly apply what you are learning, by providing you:

 Space for you to describe your (current) statement of faith related to this topic. Understanding that faith grows over time, and with additional study, a statement date is included. We STRONGLY ENCOURAGE you to write out your faith statement as it will focus your thinking and provide you a wonderful reference point for review, additional study and witnessing later.

 Space for you to briefly outline the impact this believe will have in your life by describing an action statement. This statement describes the "so what" of your personal learning application.

ACTION STATEMENT - Because I believe this, I will...

... take His word seriously (believe what it says) and commit to study, memorize and apply His word through weekly personal bible studies.

(Optional) Pre-Test

Some participating in this study series might like to complete a "pretest" to assess their current understanding of each of the topic areas and their ability to clearly articulate their individual "faith statements". This assessment can also be used at the end of the series as well to explore how your faith has been enriched by the study of scripture.

- 8. Explain the role of Christ's resurrection.
- 9. Summarize the role of the Holy Spirit.
- 10. Outline the concept of "Saved by Grace".
- 11. Characterize the role of the New Testament Church.
- 12. Describe the judgment day scene.
- 13. Explain God's plan for eternal life and eternal death.
- 14. List three of your favorite promises from God.
- 15. Describe four acts that characterize a Christ-like lifestyle.

Bonus: Describe why you decided to have a personal relationship with God.

(Optional) Scripture Memory Program

"I have hidden your word in my heart..." - Psalm 119:11a (NIV)

For each lesson in this workshop series two scriptures have been suggested as memory verses (marked with *) to help those who wish to build an active knowledge and ready use of the scriptures. The following steps may help you to write the scripture on your heart:

- 1. Look up the verse in your own bible
- 2. Pray for God to stamp the verse on your heart
- 3. Read the Verse in context.
- 4. Get the meaning of the Verse.
- 5. Read the Verse aloud.

- 6. Print/Type the Verse on a small card.
- 7. Practice (4 times without mistakes).
- 8. Review Daily.
