- As **Jesus** spoke to the Crowds of His day

Date: Around 27-31 AD Location: Galilee (1:18; 23)

Audience: Followers, sick, large crowd for across region (4:24-25)

Purpose: Preach the Good News (4:23); Kingdom at hand (4:17) Fulfill the Law and Prophecy; Correct teaching of the day





























- As Matthew wrote for audience of their day

Date: Around 80 AD

Place: Palestine or Syrian Antioch

Audience: Greek speaking Jews (OT fulfillment focus, Abraham, customs and terms)

Purpose: Prove Jesus is the Messiah (OT fulfillment — 1:22-23; 2:15,17-8,23; 4:14-16; 8:17; 12:17-21; 13:35; 27:9-10)

- As Luke wrote for audience of their day

Date: Around 59-63 or 70s-80s AD

Place: Rome or Achaia, Ephesus & Caesarea

Audience: Theophilus (1:3) (one of high position - publisher)

Purpose: Draw up an orderly account (1:3)
Strengthen the faith (know with certainty) of believers (1:4)
Message to the Gentiles

- As the **Spirit** wrote for audience of **today**

Date: Around 59-80 AD

Place: Israel

Audience: All Seekers - Holiday Park church

Purpose: Renew our faith by going back to the basic message of good news as taught by Jesus



- As **Jesus** spoke to the Crowds of His day
- As Matthew/Luke wrote for audience of their day
 - As the **Spirit** wrote for audience of today

Source/s of Sermon?

 How did Matthew know the details of the story 50+ years later?

1: It come word-for-word from Jesus

2: Sermon already existed in part of whole BEFORE gospel written (Two-Source Hypothesis - "Q" and Mark)

3: Matthew composed the sermon as he wrote the gospel (Gaulder suggests he created the beatitudes in rabbinic style to form the "kelal" summary header for sermon, then the sermon is presented in reverse order by means of triple illustration – also rabbinic practice)

4: Some combination of the above






Be...Different

Matt 5:17-20

- Why would/do some think Jesus came to abolish the Law?
- The Law and Prophets (OT) consists of doctrine, prophecy & ethical precepts... How did Jesus fulfill these?
 - How does Romans 10:1-13 relate to this teaching?

Be...Righteous

Matt 5:17-20

"...unless your righteousness surpasses that of the Pharisees and Teachers of the law, you will certainly not enter the kingdom of God."

What does this mean? How can it be harmonized with statement

about "poor in spirit"?

Spiritual bankruptcy vs. spiritual arrogance

What is your reaction to this statement?

– "...as you grow in true spiritual power and understanding you will actually find many outer rules and regulations will be come necessary...when you are no longer spiritually a minor, you will cease to need some of the outer observances that formally seemed indispensable...."

• Emmet Fox – The Sermon on the Mount 1938 p52

Be...Reconciled

- What do you see as the Themes?
- How do you think the 3 audiences would understand/ react to this message?
 - Scribes and Pharisees calculated that the Law contained 248 commands and 365 prohibitions.... Did Jesus just add to this list??
- What standard does Jesus use for determining right and wrong?
- How did this teaching suggest that He was a radical?
 - "... but I say..."?

Be...Reconciled

Matt 5:21-26

- "You nave heard..." vs. "But I tell you..."
 - Murder = judgment vs. anger = judgment
 - "Raca" (empty/idiot) = court vs. "You Fool" = hell fire
 See Matt 23:17
- What is Jesus teaching about relationships?
 - Why does God care?
 - What are the practical teachings?
- "Blessed are the peace makers...."
- What is the impact on your life?

- What do you see as the Themes?
- How do you think the 3 audiences would understand/react to this message?
 - Adultery; Divorce; Oaths
- How are our thoughts and feelings related to our behavior? Is a wrong thoughts just as destructive as a wrong deed? What is sin?
- "The only way to understand the doctrine of salvation is to start with the doctrine if sin... the doctrine of regeneration (born again) is meaningless unless you understand the doctrine of sin... there is no true evangelism without an understanding of sin... in the same way the doctrine of sin is vital to the true conception of holiness... and above all, this doctrine of sin leads us to see the absolute need of a power greater than ourselves.... Enables us to realize the greatest of God's love to us"


Be...Faithful

Matt 5:27-37

- "Sins are nothing but a symptom of a disease called SIN and it is not the symptoms that matter but the disease, for it is the disease that kill not the symptoms..."

 D. M. Lloyd-Jones

 The fact that you did not commit the act does not mean you are guiltless... what about your heart, is there disease there?
- How does Jesus teaching illustrate
 - the seriousness of sin?
 - the importance of the soul?
 - the need for purity (purification) in our lives?
 - the importance of honoring our commitments?
 - the simple importance of our word?
- "Blessed are the pure in heart...."
- What is the impact on your life?

Be...Perfect

Matt 5:38-48

- What do you see as the Themes?
- How do you think the 3 audiences would understand/react to this message?

 Exodus 21:24; Do not resist an evil person;

 Love your enemies; Be Perfect

- Eye for an Eye; Tooth for Tooth from law courts to personal relationships? What were the consequences?
- What is the role of "self" in these passages?

Turn the other cheek – retaliation/revenge (John 18:22-23)
Sue you to take your tunic – insisting on my rights (Matt 18:15-17; Acts 16:37)
Personal insult vs. honor and justice
Go with him a second – resentment to government/control (1 Peter 2)
Do not turn away the borrower – win/lose (1 John 3:17-18)

- What is the impact of the statement: "Be perfect as your heavenly father is perfect?"
 - To be God's man

Be...Perfect

Matt 5:38-48

"There was a day when I died, died to myself and my opinions, preferences, tastes and will died to the world, its approval or censure; died to the approval or blame of even my brethren and friends; and since then I have studied only to show myself approved unto God"

- Call to be unique
 Doing more than others
 Can do things no one else can
 That you may be sons of your Father in Heaven
 - Be perfect
 - morality; sin; attitude toward themselves; attitude towards others; attitude toward God; motivation; injury/injustice; in death
 Implications of Phil 2...
- He speaks with authority.... Why?

Matt 6:1-18

 Applications in Giving, Prayer, Fasting
- Be careful not to do your acts of righteousness before men (6:1)vs.....Let your light shine before men, so that they may see your good deeds?
- Ultimate choice between pleasing self and pleasing God

 The supreme matter in life ... to realize our relationship with God


Psalm 139

 - - Our Father Universal? John 17:9; Abba
 Holy and just
 Adoration forgiveness
 Conditional forgiveness? Law vs. grace?
 Luke 11:2-4 teach us to pray...
 Luke 11:5-13 repetition...
 Job 4:1-14 place before God
 Daniel 9:1-19 Phil 4:6

Be...Humble (Fasting) Matt 6:1-4

- The practice of Fasting

 Abstinence from food for spiritual purpose

 Prayer, meditation, seeking God for some particular reason or circumstance

 Matt 5:6 hunger and thirst for righteousness...

 Matt 17:20-21 but by prayer and fasting

 - Luke 5:34-35 bridegroom taken away... in those days

 - Luke 4:21 40 daysJob 23:12 treasured His words more...
 - Ecc 4:12 Threefold cord

Matt 6:19-34

- What do you see as the Themes?

 Relationship to the 'world' on earth
 "treasures"
- What treasures on earth is he talking about?
 Should we have personal property? Savings? Insurance?
 Aspire to good jobs? Respect of others? Role in the church? Etc.?
- What treasures in heaven is he talking about?
 - Eternal destiny1 Tim 6:17-19

 - Matt 25; Rich Young Ruler
- How do we practice this?

 We are but pilgrims; children going to our father placed here for His purpose

Matt 6:19-34

Your Eye?

Good, single – full of light

Bad, double – full of darkness
Focus – how much of our thought is based on earthly treasures?

- Luke 21:34-36

- Wisdom of the world = foolishness of God
- Two Masters....

Spiritual vs. worldly

- what controls your life? Daily choices... define your relationship to God
- 2 Kings 17:24-41 the Assyrians "feared the Lord but served" their graven images"

 - "Lord, Lord, did we not.....I never knew you"

 - The Lord's calf.... Examine ourselves


Be...Assured

Matt 6:19-34

- Therefore, Be not Anxious?
 - Encouragement following discussion on 2 masters?
 "Take no thought"? Repeats 3 times
 Phil 4:6-7

 - "Is not life more important than..." who are you serving?
 Not how it will be done... Just it will be done... God is giver of life
 - Romans 8:32
 - "little faith"? Eternal life view
- Seeker....

 "FIRST"....
 - His Kingdom
 - His RighteousnessPsalm 8



Be...Aware

Matt 7:1-6

- What do you see as the Themes?
- How do you think the 3 audiences would understand/react to this message?
 - Judgé Not...
 - Call for tolerance? behavior?, doctrine?
 Dogs v6; False Prophets v15
- Assessment vs. condemning Luke 18:9-14

 - Self-righteous spirit feeling superior "spirit of a Pharisee"
 Hyper-critical content and intent (constructive vs. destructive)
 1 Cor 13 vs. delights in finding faults and blemishes
- Within the body...

 Romans 14:1-23
- Why not judge?

 "Let ye be judged..." will be paid back with own coin (criticism)

 Judged by God part of the fear of the Lord....

 2 Cor 11:27-32

- Why not judge?

 - Setting our own standard for judgment
 Judged based on my claim/belief (i.e. great knowledge)

 - Beam on our own eye...
 We are incapable of judgment without bias/motive
 Impaired vision to 'help' others
 Motive judging spirit as the beam?
- Do not give dogs what is sacred....

 Is this not judging?

 Balance? Discrimination vs. condemnation

 - Dog = wild scavenger; Swine = uncleanUnbeliever?
 - Look at His practice proud Pharisee vs. publican or sinner
 Never varied the truth His presentation
 Paul Acts 13:46

 - Discernment by the Spirit learn to give to each (answer Pilot; Silent Herod)
 Teach sin and salvation (only) to non-believer; milk to meat to believer
 Are the some with whom the gospel should not be shared?

Be...a Seeker

Matt 7:7-11

- Read Scripture Matt 7:7-11
- What do you see as the Themes?
- How do you think the 3 audiences would understand/react to this message?
 - Promise...

 - Anything I ask God will give??
 What is the role of 'context' in truly understanding this scripture?
 In light of this sermon for what would you ask? What would you seek?
- Divine pattern.... understanding

 Of Truth (His nature) what it demands

 Of Sin (my state) what it results in

 Of Salvation (His action) what can be done

 Of Faith (my response) what I do
- What are the implications of v.7-11 in your life?

 Everything is available

 Respond in faith... ask, knock

 2 Peter 1:3-11 Memorize it!!

Matt 7:7-11

- Re-read Matt 6:25-34 How does 7:7-11 relate to 6:25-34
- 'Golden Rule'....

 - "So"....
 What is the principle taught?
 Easy method for application...
 How does it sum up the Law and Prophets?
- "...what really matters in life is not so much the various things that come to meet us, and with which we have to deal, as our readiness to meet them."

 - The rain?
